The Overall's, show stopper, 1957 Nomad with Cinnamon beige paint sat in a SW OKC field for 15 years sporting many bullet holes and missing parts before Billy started the complete frame off restoration in 1999. Finishing in 2008 the Nomad is powered by a Chevy 350 bored .030 over, R700 automatic transmission, P/S, Front Power Disc Brakes, A/C and Cassette.


The beige vinyl front seats and console were snagged from a 1989 Pontiac Bonneville, the rear seat is original and the front suspension was lowered 2 inches.

Club member True Osborn had the pleasure to chauffer Meteorologist Gary England dedication and retirement farewell at OU Owens field.

Mr. England is recognized, along with the firm <u>Enterprise Electronics</u>, as initiating development of the first commercial <u>Doppler weather radar</u>. While the <u>National Weather Service</u> is the only one legally responsible for issuing warnings in the <u>United States</u>, Mr. England is credited with issuing the first televised Doppler weather radar bulletin for a tornado, in March 1982.

In 1990 he helped create <u>First Warning</u>, a state map which appeared in the corner of the television screen, with counties colored in to indicate storm watches and warnings. In 1991 England also helped create <u>Storm Tracker</u>, a computer program that provided the audience with the time of arrival of severe weather. First Warning And Storm Tracker are used nationwide. He also helped create <u>I-News</u>, a computer program that allows <u>PC</u> users to receive both severe weather and breaking news alerts on their computer.

In November, he'll be inducted into the Oklahoma Hall of Fame.
