Classic cars and motorcycles were a big part of Rudy's youth. At the age of 16, Rudy's first car was a 1956 4-door Buick. It was in excellent condition and only paid \$50.00. He kept the car for about a year. Next he bought a 1956 original 4-door Chevy. After having this car for a while he had to sell it because Uncle Sam had other plans for him. Coming out of the Army, Rudy turned his adventure to motorcycles. He and a group of guys would go on weekend runs. He even bought a tricycle because Gloria would not ride a two-wheel motorcycle (and still won't to this day). He always said that when the boys (our children) started to ask him for rides on the bikes it was time to sell them. Well that time came and he went back to the classics. From 1977 to 1983, Rudy had the following cars. 1941 2-door Chevy coupe. 1939 Chevy, 1956 4-door Chevy, 1954 5-window Chevy pick-up truck, 1964 super sport, and a 1955 2-door Chevy which we brought with us from California to Oklahoma in 1983. He sold that five years later and was classic free for the next ten years. Raising four children and keeping them in sports took a lot of

our time. There was no time for the classic cars until our daughter Sunshine was turning 15 years old. Most of the club members know what I'm talking about. After having the club caravan her party Rudy started to get classic fever once again. But knowing how much we wanted to get involve this time around we still had to put it on hold. Once all of our children were grown and out of the home we decided it was our turn to live it up. He started with a 1939 4-door Chevy. He put that car in a few shows and got a buyer. Next was a 1939 2-door and a 1958 Bel Air. One weekend Rudy went to a Car Auction in Cushing, Oklahoma. He didn't find anything worth buying until he was pulling out and saw a man driving his 1954 station wagon with a for sale sign on it. Lucky for us the auction was over and the man was too late. Rudy stopped and talked to the gentlemen. The car belonged to his wife who had been in a nursing home and needed the money to pay her bills. Gloria has always been a big fan of wagons so I took her to see the car. She looked it over and said buy it. After buying the wagon, I sold the 58 Bel Air. I still have the 1939, which has a buyer and parts to sell for 2-1939 Chevy's, 1- 1953 station wagon, 1- 1954 4-door Bel Air and a complete 1939 Chevy. The passion for classic cars has always been a big part of Rudy's life and he is trying to pass this passion on to our grandchildren.
