
In closing, on behalf of all who attended, I want to thank the Dallas Club. It was obvious a lot of hard work and planning went into this event and we appreciate your efforts.

2008 Classic Chevy Fall Foliage Tour

For the first time in 14 years DACC hosted the event October 24-26 in Denison, TX. A record 44 cars from four states participated.

Bill & Diane Preston planned the weekend. DACC members Don & Jo Andre, Greg & Bev Hedum, Dan Bunch & Vickie Penney helped make it happen. Also attending were Jerry & Diane Bray, BJ & Mini Bucher, Larry, Dianne, Tim & Carisa Epperson, James & Trish Sparrow.

Several couples arrived early and enjoyed Denison's Old Downtown Antique Shops, Art Galleries, Art Studios, the Historic Eisenhower birth place and the casino in Durant. With the arrival of the first group from Oklahoma City about 2 p.m. Friday, the Comfort Inn lobby started filling with old friends checking into their rooms and picking up their event materials.
