

Blevins was a good friend of Curtis and Kay Welch and many other COCCC members.


Even as a former club member he continued to work the Bricktown show with and for us. Ted was a good friend to the COCCC and he will be missed.



COCCC shines at Starbird Rod & Custom Show




The club had a prime location in the exhibit hall.































Cruisin' the Coast COCCC style


