Make your plans for next year starting now! The Tulsa club is in charge of arrangements. I hear we will be heading for SE Oklahoma somewhere. We will see ya there.

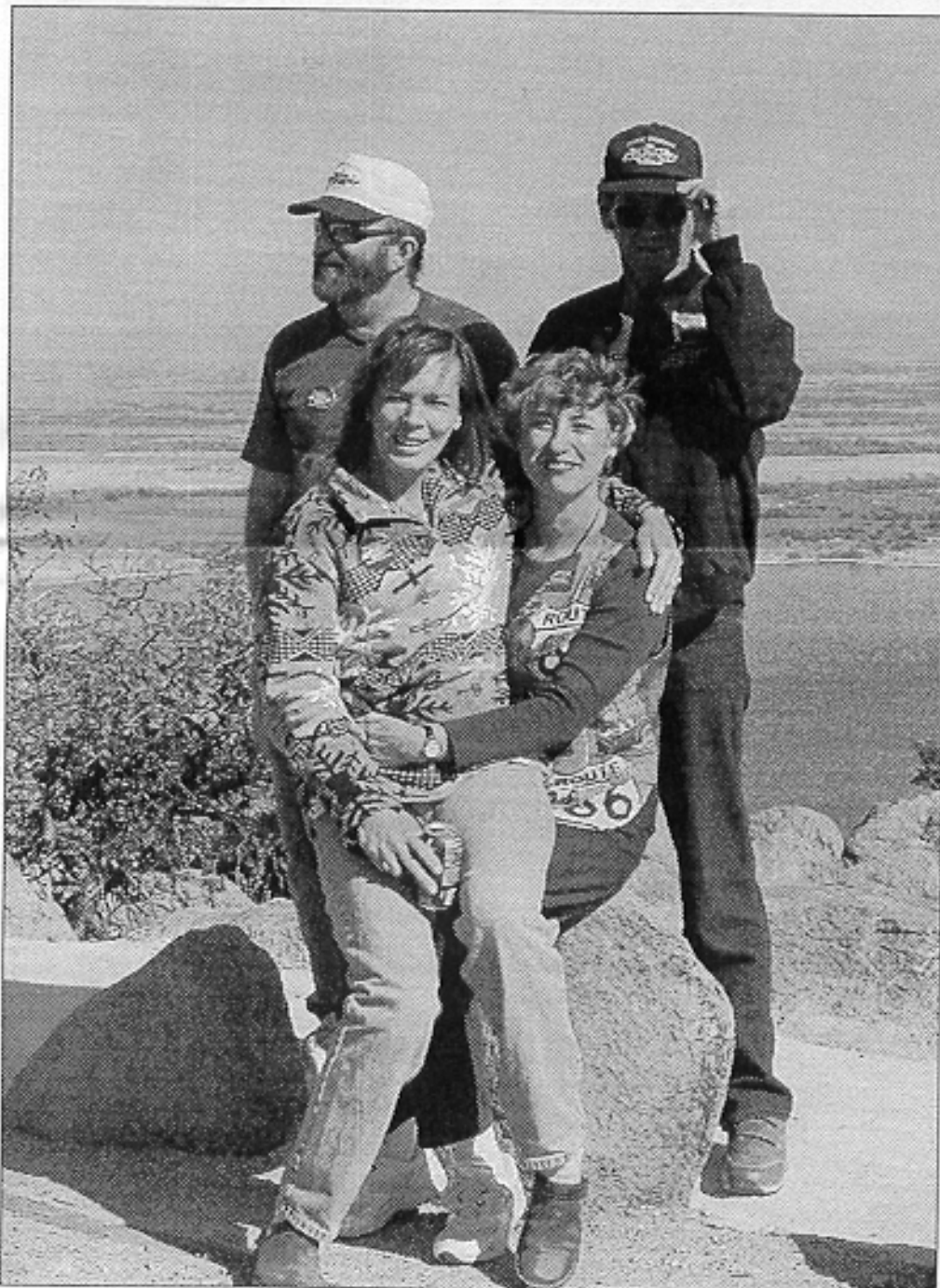

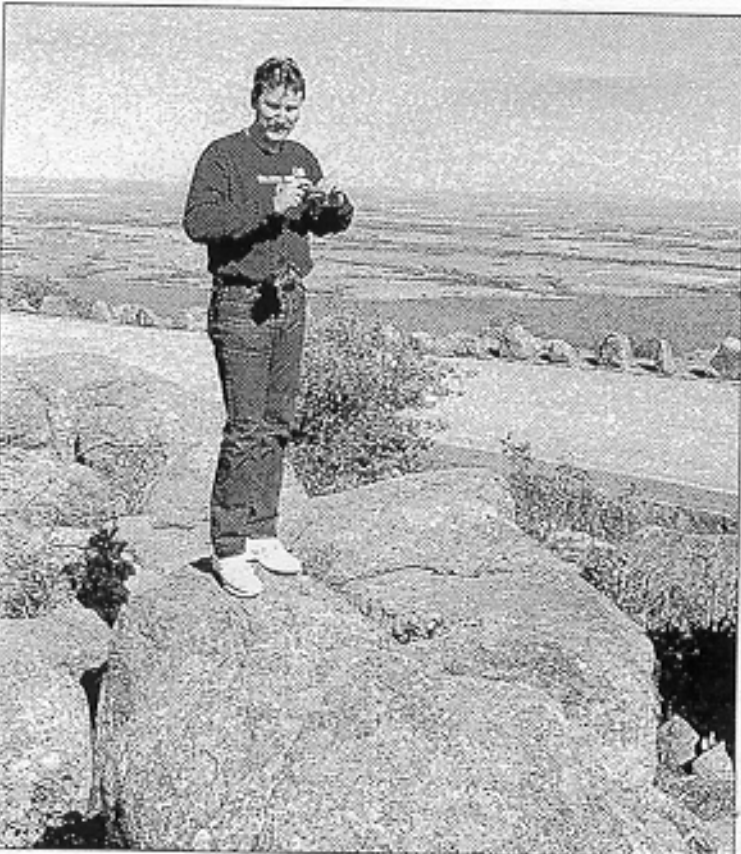
One of the stops on this year's Fall Foliage Cruise was at the prairie dog village. We had quite a lineup of cars.

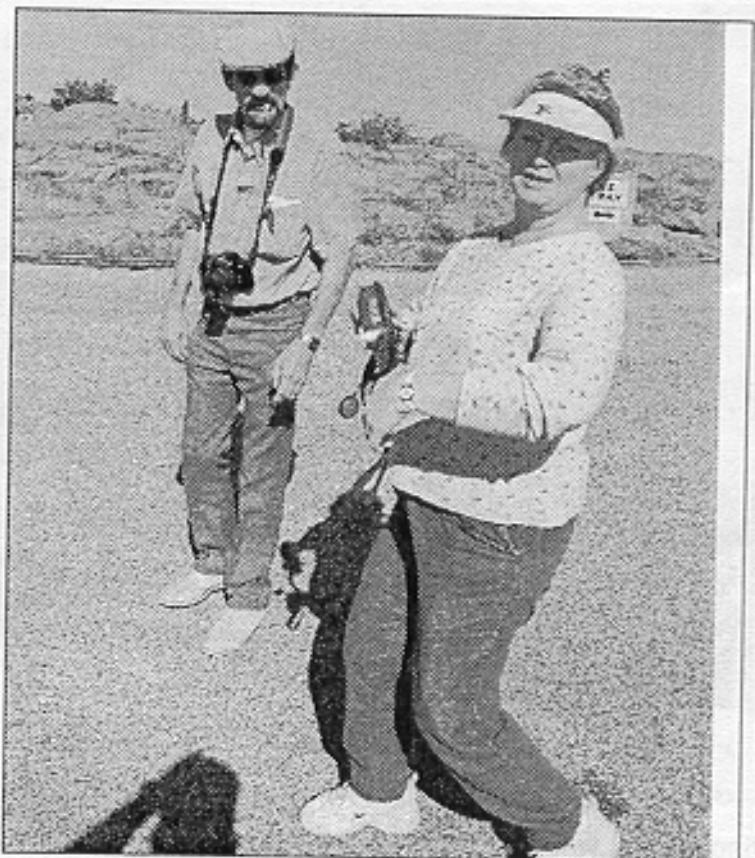

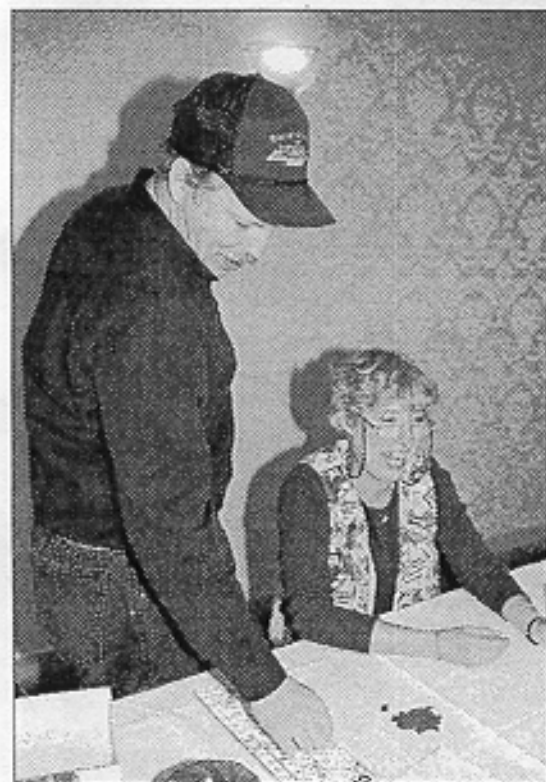

Saturday night fever



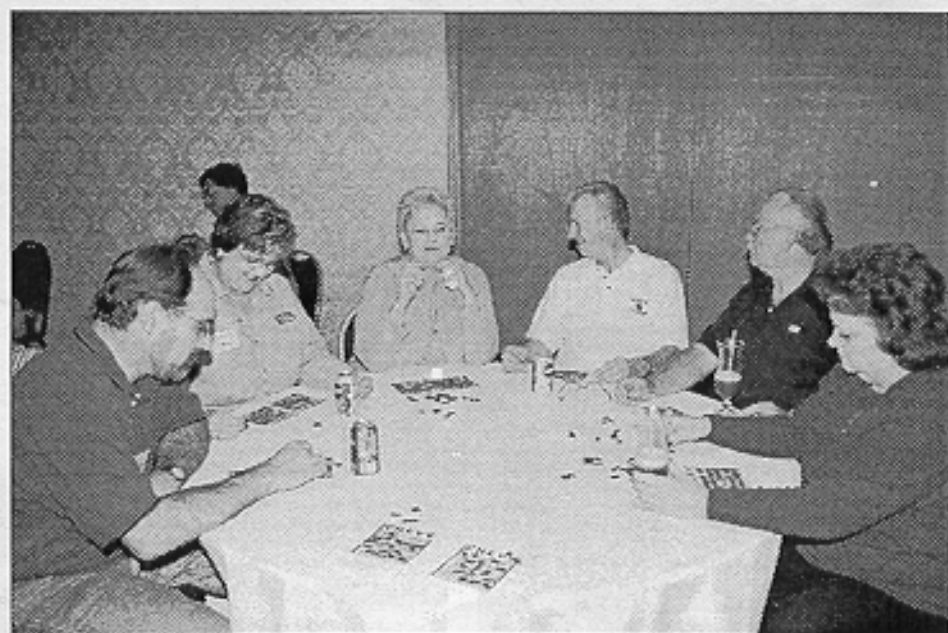

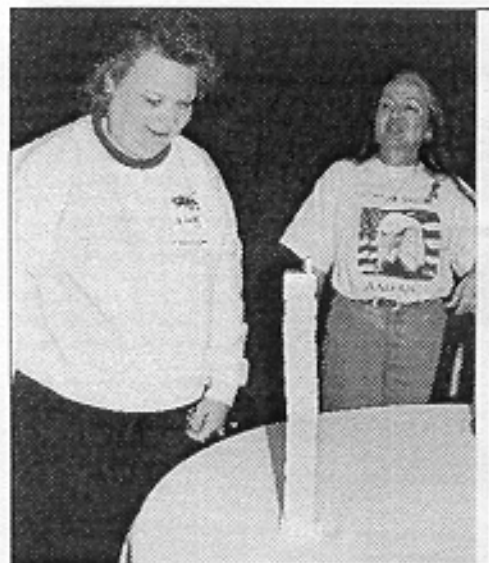

Mel Harris played waiter Friday night and brought his wife Rustyne a margarita.



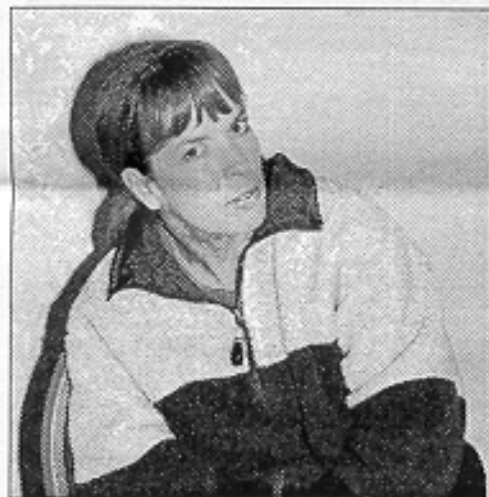

Poker was just one of the games played Friday night. For some reason David wore this crown. To his right Larry Myers laughs at the sight.



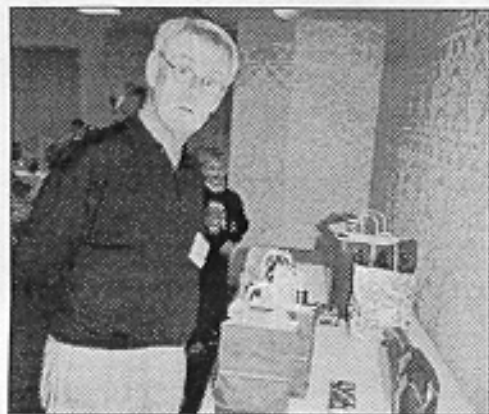

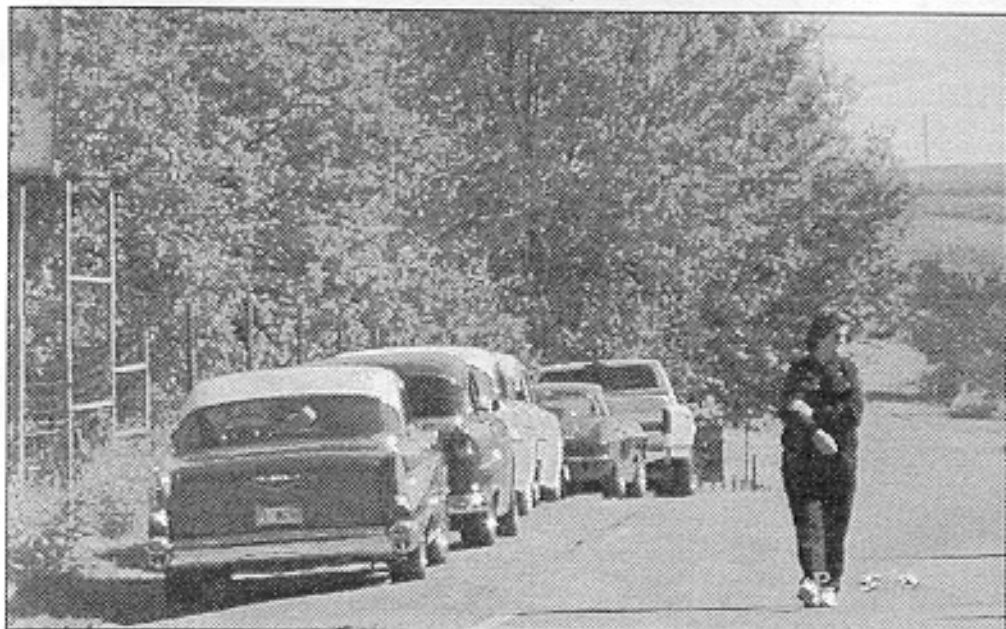

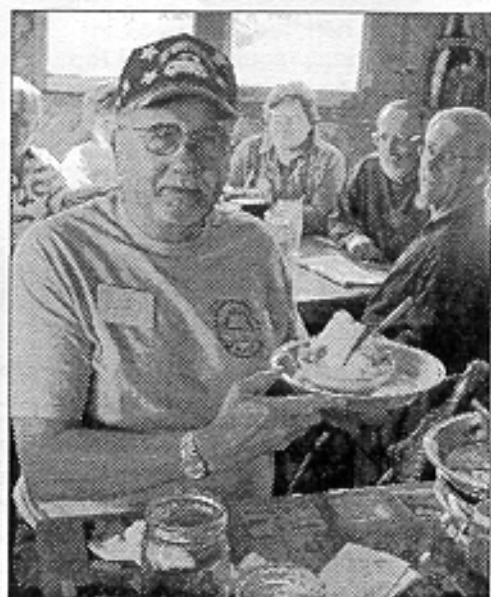

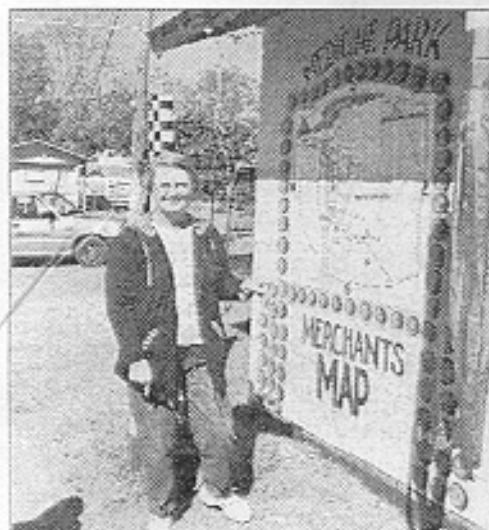

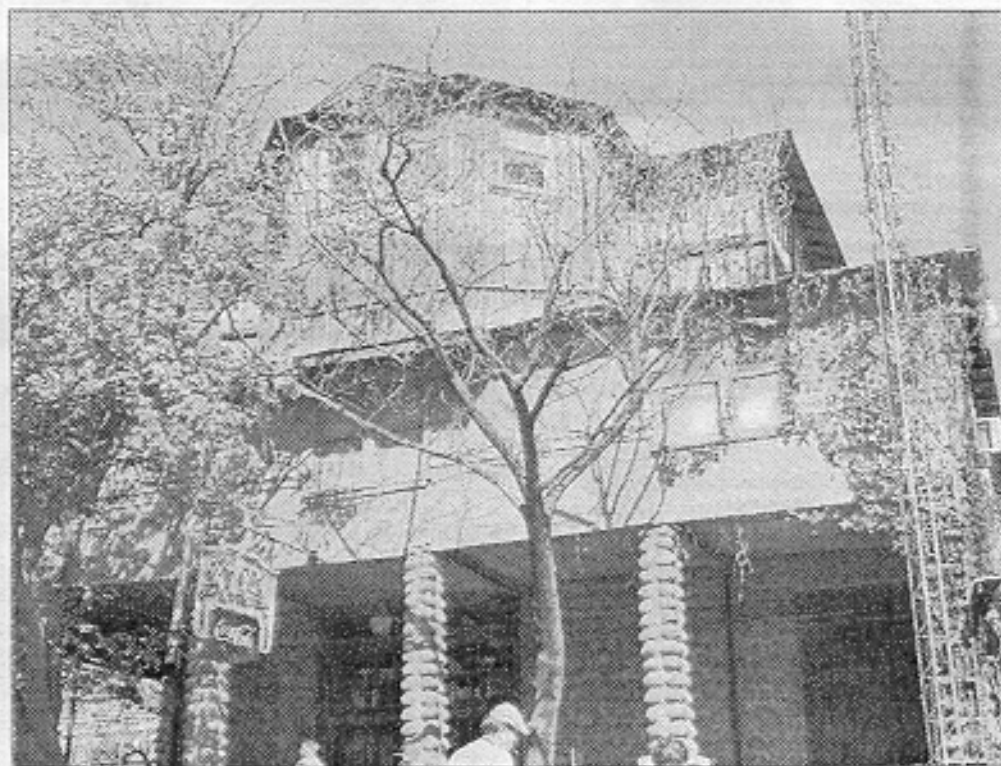
